

## 2007 Spring General Grant Awards

**Boys and Girls Club of Cape Cod, Inc. ([www.boysgirlsclubcapecod.org](http://www.boysgirlsclubcapecod.org))**

\$1,000 to help fund Project Learn, a program designed to engage young people in learning, encourage them to succeed in school, develop the skills they will need in the workplace, and foster a desire to become life long learners.

**Cape & Islands Self-Reliance Corporation ([www.reliance.org](http://www.reliance.org))**

\$1,200 to support Junior Solar Sprint (JSS). JSS is a program for middle school students to design, build and race solar powered cars, while fostering an interest in solar and renewable energy technologies.

**Cape & Islands Workforce Investment Board ([www.ciwib.org](http://www.ciwib.org))**

\$1,500 to provide intensive case management for 40 court involved individuals, 18-24. The program will enroll the individuals in an education or training program or find them employment.

**Cape Cod Challenger Club, Inc. ([www.capecodchallenger.org](http://www.capecodchallenger.org))**

\$1,500 to secure funding for activity fees at playing fields, swimming pools, playground and to pay for uniforms, trophies, and equipment for the Club, which provides recreational opportunities for children/young adults with disabilities.

\$1,500 to implement a pilot project, Supporting Families Through Divorce, in collaboration with the Barnstable Probate and Family Court's CAP (Children and Parents) program, to support children of divorcing parents through the first year of the divorce.

\$1,599 to purchase a Smart Board (interactive white board technology) to better meet the educational needs of the 60 special needs students from 19 school districts that the school serves.

**Cape Cod Commercial Hook Fishermen's Association ([www.ccchfa.org](http://www.ccchfa.org))**

\$2,000 for equipment and materials needed for a project to support the rehab and maintenance of the Cedar Pond ecosystem, one of the many threatened coastal ecosystems that provide critical environmental services and buffers the land and sea.

**Cape Cod Council of Churches**

\$2,500 to support a "Client Emergency Fund" for homeless individuals in Overnights of Hospitality to be used to secure more permanent housing or for critical needs such as medical needs or food.

**Cape Cod Free Clinic & Community Health Center ([www.capecodclinic.org](http://www.capecodclinic.org))**

\$1,500 to help purchase an Electrocardiogram (EKG) machine that will interface directly with the electronic medical record system in the Free Clinic's new building.

\$10,000 to support the Mobile Medical Team which will provide medical outreach, direct health care services, and case management services to homeless persons and at risk of homelessness around Cape Cod.

\$1,500 for a computer, loggers, and programs that will allow students and faculty to use data from wind turbine, to be installed on campus, to transfer information on wind speed, direction, and power generation from the turbine to the classrooms and the web.

\$1,500 to hire teachers and educational performers, to plan and implement workshops, and to purchase equipment and supplies for this free eight week, community focused literacy support program.

\$1,500 for funding of the Building Fund, which will allow the Juice Bar to expand services and accomplish the goal of becoming a Family Resource Center.

\$625 to purchase PastPerfect 4.0 computer software, which is the museum archival filing system used by most Cape Cod museum facilities. This will enable them to better position themselves in developing Cape-wide sharing network of historical information and to increase their digital archiving abilities.

\$5,000 to reconfigure radiology services and upgrade digital radiography. This will allow OCHS to provide diagnosis and treatment in real time.

\$1,500 to purchase adaptive aids, such as talking items, large print items, and medical management devices, for low-income visually impaired clients that they need to carry out every day tasks.

\$1,500 to help fund Pathmakers, which provides monthly training and support meetings for low income, divorced or unemployed women from Cape Cod who have returned to school.
