



## The Chatham Fund 2021 Grant Recipients

The Fund awarded a total of \$70,250 to 9 nonprofit organizations through this grantmaking program.

### **Alzheimer's Family Caregiver Support Center, \$5,000**

To fund free support groups for Chatham's Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementias community.

### **Behavioral Health Innovators, \$250**

For the Recovery/BUILD Alternative Peer Group Program to support students at Monomoy High School.

### **Cape Abilities, \$5,000**

To support its "Growing Friendships" program that partners a volunteer with a Cape Abilities participant to build relationships and foster friendships.

### **Family Pantry of Cape Cod, \$5,000**

To support its "Healthy Eating for Healthy Living" program, which will provide 20,000 meals to Chatham residents in need during 2022.

### **Monomoy Community Services, \$25,000**

To support outreach and operations maintenance for existing programs and resources used by the most economically challenged members of the Chatham community.

### **Chatham Orpheum Theatre, \$1,000**

To support its Senior Movie Day, which provides free movies to assisted living facilities in Chatham.

### **Elder Services of Cape Cod & the Islands, \$6,500**

To support "Meals on Wheels" in Chatham, a program that provides nutritionally balanced meals to elders.

### **Homeless Prevention Council, \$7,500**

For personalized case management for Chatham residents to access financial resources, housing preservation, and other programs that promote stability. This grant was supplemented with a \$1,000 contribution from The Harwich Fund of The Cape Cod Foundation and \$1,500 from the Dorothy F. and George W. Cahoon, Jr. Fund of The Cape Cod Foundation to provide similar case management services to Harwich and Orleans residents.

### **Lower Cape Outreach Council, \$15,000**

To support the organization's program which provides direct financial assistance to Chatham residents for rent, utilities, transportation, medical bills, prescriptions, childcare, and other essentials.
