



2024 Targeted Nonprofit Capacity Building Program Grant Recipients

The Cape Cod Foundation awarded \$294,342 in grants to 12 nonprofit organizations to support their internal infrastructure, through the 2024 Targeted Nonprofit Capacity Building Grant Program. Grants will support technology upgrades, board development, HR strategies, staff expansion, volunteer recruitment, codification of best practices, and program expansion. Grantees will participate in regularly facilitated conversations with each other to build strong connections for problem-solving and collaborative action.

Association to Preserve Cape Cod, \$25,000

To technology and systems upgrading and associated staff training for enhanced operations.

B FREE Wellness, Inc., \$25,000

To enhance board development and HR procedures to grow and sustain impact, especially services to the BIPOC community.

Barnstable Land Trust, \$25,000

To support the hiring of a new land stewardship role to increase organizational capacity and enhance land conservation value.

Cape Abilities \$25,000

To improve service efficiency and quality.

Cape Cod Toy Library, \$24,342

To increase community engagement, strategic development, and sustainability.

Center for Coastal Studies, \$25,000

To design and implement a Scientist/Artist-in-Residence organization-wide approach to improve science literacy for a wider and more diverse audience.

Entrepreneurship for All Cape Cod, \$25,000

To develop a strategy and pilot efforts to increase the number of volunteers from traditionally underrepresented backgrounds.

Friends of Herring River, Wellfleet/Truro, \$25,000

To improve operational capacity and internal systems while working toward greater coastal restoration outcomes and partnerships.

Kennedy Donovan Center, \$25,000

To enhance services, promote retention, and meet growing demand.

Latinx in Action, \$25,000

For board development, staff expansion, technology and security upgrades.

Lower Cape Outreach Council, \$25,000

For strengthening development staffing toward increasing support to meet Lower Cape residents' growing basic human needs.

Massachusetts Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, \$20,000

To increase impact of the Community Outreach Team and overall programs by increasing capacity of the Adoption Center.
